Beak a little convex 1 inch long
upper part blackish lower part white
its general colours are 2 shades
of a brownish mouse colour down the
back belly quite white & downy
feathers wings dark mouse colour
& white variegated
legs olive green webs yellowish
green talons flat
this bird measured 20 1/2 in from
tip to tip of wings
Body 2 1/2 thick & 3 in wide being flat
underneath
From Beak to tail 10 1/2 in

Sorting specimens of Rocks and burying them
until I may return to require them

The Evening is serene & beautiful a calm sea
reflecting the full moon and very little wind SW
I wonder we do not see the Whale boat they could
not desire better weather

Monday July 9th

Fine Morning, and the sea as smooth as water
with now and then a grand wave upon the shore a
gentle breeze from SW.

The Men have been occupied the whole day
in carrying the remainder of the Provisions luggage
tent tools utensils Firearms &c up the Road - I
struck the Tent and after leaving the following
nailed up inside the Blankets "All removed
to the new Camp about 3 miles up the Road"
I took my Knapsack Pistols Telescope with the Tent pole
and some other articles and followed the party to the
New Camp where we all arrived (the men having
made two trips with heavy loads) just in time to
get the Tent pitched & a fire made before dark
the ground here is so damp and wet at this season
we have been obliged to contrive a sort of sleeping
place by putting a Slab of Bark upon Logs which
