

K. Dallas.

- Adopted March 1932 -
- No Uni Labour Club till after WWII
- WA activities considered political but not party/political
- Conspiracy by Arts Council against me: A Ogilvie very critical of WA.
- direct funding by Govt.
- ? Dismissed as WA ^{secretaryship} teacher during war - Counsel's?
still cont'd as WA lecturer.

McKenna - addressed Uni Labour Club at time ~~the~~ Committee Dissolution Bill
- rigging in union ballots.

Hylton - never expressed political views
- role of UC overshadowed by Royal Commission
- took blame for many of Morris's actions.

~~the~~ Dallas - no part in demands for R. Commission. ^{Morris}
- feeling of shame that in 7as, the man responsible for ensuring justice
was in the witness box answering maladministration charges

pre R.C. - law faculty virtually ran the Uni
- feeling by other faculties that law received preferential treatment

Coxon - matriculation standards - deletion of reference by Morris.
- Adult Education

Staff united after R. Commission apart from about 1/2 day

Orr - not a leader, a nuisance & embarrassment to Staff Association

Morris - not competent in academic matters.

~~the~~ - appointment of Orr - ^A convenience, departure from strict
academic practices.
^{for talking up himself - Morris wanted him to}
also reg'd as part of his duties to make public
pronouncements on ~~other~~ ^{but public matters}
no left wing tendencies
